Yuki Press was established in 2004 to fill a gap in the market for distinctive Arabic books for children. Since then it has also branched out into English and French.



This pioneering book, the first in a new medical series by Yuki Press, tackles the often-taboo subject of autism. Narrated by a young girl, who cannot understand why her neighbour Tamer never wants to join in with the others in the playground, it gently explores the mechanisms of autism. Tamer never looks anyone in the eye; he likes to repeat certain actions over and over again; he does not like physical contact. At first the narrator is puzzled by his behaviour but with time she realizes that Tamer is special - and gifted. She is amazed when he shows her how to do her maths homework. She is thrilled she teaches him to play hopscotch. This tactful journey of discovery is portrayed through a sensitive text coupled with inventive visuals.

Through a sensitive text and cheerful illustrations, the young narrator explains how her friend became sick with an illness hidden in her body. Different stages are explored such as how the child lost her lovely hair, but wore a beautiful hat; and when she could not come to school, her classmates sent her cards and presents to hospital. The book conveys a message of hope, backed by medical statistics.





Yuki Press is already well known for its alphabet learning tools, with books, games and puzzles designed to help youngsters recognize Arabic letters and sounds. The World of Alphabets, Yuki's latest learning aide adapts the Chinese pictorial style of alphabet to transform Arabic letters into easily assimilated images which aide recognition and memory. Each letter becomes an item which it closely resembles, so that nuun becomes a flower, taa' is drawn as a pot with its two dots forming the cover, and baa' becomes a parachute with its dot as the parachutist, and so on.

This same book has been adapted to help foreigners become acquainted with the Arabic alphabet by using a combination of the Arabic letters, Western letters and the images based on the shape of the Arabic letter, plus a transliteration table as a pronunciation guide.






